“It is the Culture that unites not the Religion”: Dr. Najma Heptulla, Hon. Union Minister

One day Annual Conference of the State Minorities Commissions began by inaugurating the Conference at New Delhi on February 24, 2016 by Dr. Najma Heptulla, Hon'ble Union Minister for Minority Affairs, who said while in her inaugural address that **it is the culture that unites not the religion**. The culture is the thread that puts flowers of all religions into a garland, she added. Emphasizing the focus of the Central Government being inclusive growth with motto “**Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas**”, the Minister said to discriminate means to deprive of development. In a federal system, the Centre can plan and devise Schemes but the implementation lies with the States, she further added. The Minister asked the conference to discuss ways for monitoring the implementation of various Schemes. Dr. Najma urged participants to be more responsible, vigilant and willing to evolve a system for State-Centre Cooperation and not Competition. The spirit of cooperation and support in identifying areas in need of development and monitoring the implementation of various Schemes can immensely benefit all stakeholders. She said that Ministry is focusing on empowering minorities through education and skill development and asked for supporting this endeavor.

Disclosing that **Haj Pilgrimage** is being transferred to the Ministry of Minority Affairs, Dr. Najma Heptulla said that in-principle decision to this effect has been taken and modalities are to be worked out for its implementation.



The development of every section of the society is “**Rashtrdharma**” of the Government. “**Sabka Sath, Sabka Vikas**” is not a political slogan but it is a commitment to take light of development to all sections of the society. This was stated by Shri Mukhtar Abbas Naqvi, Hon'ble Union Minister of State for Minority Affairs and Parliamentary Affairs, while delivering the Valedictory address at the Annual Conference of State Minorities Commissions. He said the steps taken with this commitment for socio-economic-educational empowerment of Minorities have started yielding results at grass root level.

Shri Naqvi said that the Central Government has taken various steps for empowerment of Minorities which include programmes like “Prime Minister’s new 15-Point Programme”, “Multi-Sectoral Development Programme”, “Mission Empowerment”, “Sikho Aur Kamao”, “Ustad”, “Hamari Dharohar”, “Manas”, “Nayi Manzil”, “Nayi Raushani”, “Scholarship for students”, “Padho Pardes”, “Jiyo Parsi”. These Schemes are strong steps to provide light of development to the last person in the society.

The contribution of minorities in nation building is a “truth of history and reality of the present”. The Minorities are equal contributors in the country’s development and there is a need to strengthen this feeling, he added.

Earlier Sh. Naseem Ahmad, Chairman, NCM welcoming the participants said that though SMCs work independently in their respective States but NCM feels that all are sister organizations working towards similar objectives. It is a platform for all stake holders to share and update themselves on issues relating to minorities.

This one day Conference was focused on Development of Minorities with two Technical Sessions besides the Inaugural and the Valedictory. Shri Praveen Davar, Member (NCM) addressed the Technical-I Session on “Minority Welfare Schemes of Government of India-An Overview” while Technical-II Session on “Functioning of State Minorities Commissions-Problems and Challenges” was addressed by Smt. Mabel Rebello, another Member (NCM).



Shri Rakesh Garg, IAS (UP-1980), has assumed the charge as Secretary, Ministry of Minority Affairs w.e.f. February 01, 2016. Shri Garg did his B.E. from IIT Roorkee and M.Tech from IIT, Delhi. He also did his MBA from the University of Ljubljana (pronounced as Lubliana) in Slovenia. He is an Alumnus of Harvard Kennedy School (John F. Kennedy School, Harvard Univ).

Before joining IAS, he worked for 2 years in Indian Railways. In IAS, he worked as Secretary (Industries), Director (Udyog Bandhu, a Single Window Clearance & Grievance Redressal for Industries) and Commissioner (Sales Tax). He also worked for Non-Conventional Energy, Agricultural Marketing and Urban Development. Shri Garg also held important positions, in the State & Central Government, such as Principal Secretary to Chief Minister and Secretary / Special Secretary to Governor. He also served as Telecom Secretary in Government of India before moving to Ministry of Minority Affairs.

Shri Garg has been awarded by Govt. of Uttar Pradesh for outstanding work as District Magistrate, Banda, and has also received Presidential Silver Medal in 1991 for exemplary work in the field of Census Operations.
