



Computerization of Waqf Properties will be resumed soon @Karnataka Board of Auqaf

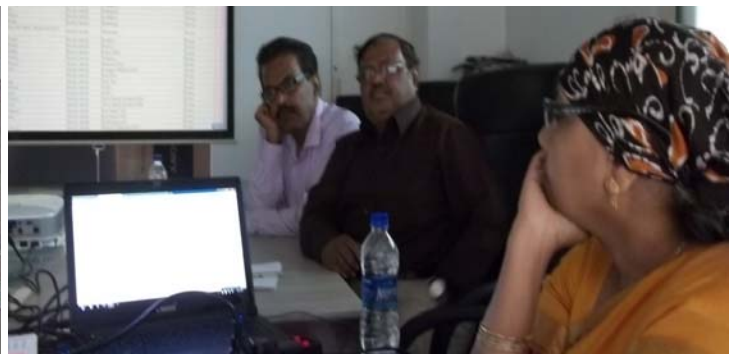
A high level meeting took place at Karnataka State Board of Auqaf, Bangaluru on 14th February 2015 chaired by Hon'ble Chairperson Dr. Mohammed Yousuff and attended by Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Shri S.A. Jeelani, IAS; Addl.CEO Smt. Nusrath M. Begum; Asstt. Secretary, Shri Mohammad Aslam; Shri M.Muneer Ahmed, PRO & Nodal Officer (WAMSI); Other Officers & Staff of Karnataka State Board of Auqaf and Shri Naeem Ahmed, Technical Director (NIC) & National WAMSI Project Coordinator from New Delhi.

Shri Naeem Ahmed, had informed the participants that Government of India is very keen on Computerization of Waqf Records and therefore, provided funds to almost all State/UT Waqf Boards (a) to procure ICT Infrastructure including Sound-Proof Diesel Generator (DG) Set & Uninterrupted Power Supply (UPS) Equipments, (b) to establish their Centralized Computing Facilities (CCF) Room and (c) to subscribe to the Internet Services. This is done to implement the recommendations of Joint Parliamentary Committee Report on Waqf, for achieving (a) efficient management of Waqf Properties, (b) transparency in the working of State/UT Waqf Boards, and (c) protect the Waqf Properties from unauthorized occupants. Shri Ahmed emphasized that the computerization work is a journey, which has to be traveled by the staff & officers of the State/UT Waqf Boards in their day-to-day working with the help of ICT Tools. But sadly, Karnataka State Board of Auqaf had entrusted this work to an outsourcing agency for almost two years that was working in isolation. Neither Staff/Officer of the Karnataka State Board of Auqaf is being benefited by their activities nor WAMSI On-line System was reflecting any progress.

Shri M. Muneer Ahmed, Nodal Officer (WAMSI) informed the participants that at present there is no competent manpower in the Karnataka State Board of Auqaf to handle WAMSI Operations. Technical Manpower deployed earlier has left the job because the Government of India had stopped the Hand-holding Funds after three years as per the Scheme. In fact, handholding was meant to transfer the knowledge as well as to train/guide the staff & officers of State/UT Waqf Boards for WAMSI Operations. Unfortunately, that did not happen in Karnataka State Board of Auqaf. Commenting on this peculiar state of affairs, Shri Naeem Ahmed had requested the Chief Executive Officer to appoint a technically qualified person under whose control all the Data Entry Operators in various Sections/Divisions of the Karnataka State Board of Auqaf, should work in uniformity.

After detailed deliberations on the subject matter, apart from Power Point Presentation on the progress of other State/UT Waqf Boards & live demo of GIS features using WAMSI platform, following decisions were taken:

1. To update first the Kitabul Auqaf Registers of all the Waqf Institutions and their Properties district-wise on top priority basis.
2. To appoint an IT Systems Manager with minimum qualification of B.Tech/BE/MCA & MBA/PGDBA (preferably) and four Data Entry Operators to assist the IT Systems Manager and simultaneously to take-up the task of feeding the data in the four Modules of WAMSI On-line System vis-à-vis respective Sections/Divisions of Karnataka State Board of Auqaf.
3. To withdraw the services of Outsourcing Agency forthwith and to obtain the data which they have entered in the XLS Sheet.
4. To make afresh entries of data as per the updated Kitabul Auqaf.
5. To purchase Computers, other input Devices such as GPS Receivers, Digital Camera, etc, if necessary.
