## Imam Nasir Waqf Jalandhar

Imam Nasir Waqf at Jalandhar City of Punjab State is comprises of Tomb of Imam Nasir and his disciple “*Kafan Chor*” which is about 1,100 years old. The complex is also having a Jama Masjid and Madarsa inside. There are number of Shops on the periphery of the complex, located inside a very busy old city Bazaar of Jalandhar. Its **Waqf ID is PB040928**.



Sufi Saint Nasiruddin was born Imam Nasruddin Abu Yusuf Chishti in Iran in 252 Hijri and came to India when he was 30. He died at the age of 82. He was first found at Nakodar by some milkmen who brought him in Jalandhar because he had miraculously saved them from a demon who extorted milk from them. Later, he wrote “Shahnama Islam”, a religious Muslim Text at Jalandhar.

“*Kafan Chor*” used to steal Shrouds from Graves. Imam Saheb called him and said it is not a good deed but he did not heed to his advice. Then one day Imam Saheb commanded his another disciple to dug out a grave and bury him and spread the rumors that Imam Saheb had died. He also commanded him not to tell the facts to anybody. As usual, the “*Kafan Chor*” opened his grave on second night and found extreme brightness and fainted. Regaining consciousness, Imam Saheb told him that he still has time to change his habits and follow the right path. From that very incident, he became great follower of Imam Saheb and stayed with him for 12 years. Imam Sahib made a will that this disciple be buried next to him as an example for ages for humanity. Thus, his grave is alongside of Imam Sahib in the Tomb.

## Minister’s Important Events



Hon'ble Union Minister for Minority Affairs, **Shri K. Rahman Khan** inaugurated the National Conference on Waqf (Amendments) Act, 2013 on November 6, 2013. The conference was organized to update and sensitize Chairpersons and CEOs of State Waqf Boards across the country. Speaking on the occasion, the Minister said many new provisions have been added in the Act, for better administration and protection of Waqf Properties. Definition of Waqf has been modified to allow non-Muslims also to create Waqf. If the tenancy, lease or license has expired or been terminated, this would be considered as encroachment. Central Waqf Council (CWC) has been empowered to issue directives to the State Waqf Boards on their Financial Performance, Survey, Maintenance of Waqf Deeds, Revenue Records, and Encroachment of Waqf Properties, seeking Annual Reports and Audit Reports. Any dispute arising out of a directive issued by the Central Waqf Council to be referred to a Board of Adjudication to be constituted by the Central Government, to be presided over by a retired judge of the Supreme Court or a retired Chief Justice of a High Court. ‘Sale’, ‘Gift’, ‘Mortgage’, ‘Exchange’ and ‘Transfer’ of Waqf Properties have been prohibited to curb alienation of Waqf Properties. ‘Lease’ of Waqf Properties is being allowed except Mosque, Dargah, Khanquah, Graveyard and Imambara, for upto 30 years for commercial activities, education or health purposes and upto 3 years for Agricultural Land.
